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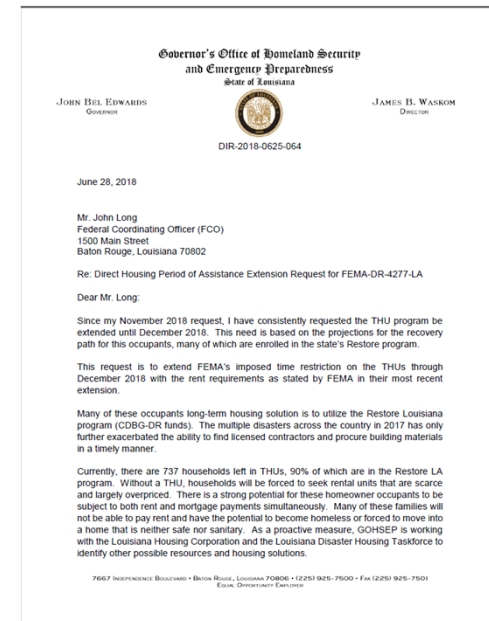
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Current Request to FEMA

- On June 28, GOHSEP requested again that FEMA extend the MHU program through December 2018.
- Request is pending with FEMA HQ
- FEMA's previous extensions have been 3 month extensions
 - ▶ Feb – May
 - ▶ Jun - Aug



GOHSEP's MHU Transition Initiative

■ Current Situational Awareness

- ▶ GOHSEP participates in a Multi-Agency Rehousing Panel to bridge the gap between the established rehousing programs and the long term housing committees, as well as to resolve a long-term solution for the remaining MHU population.
- ▶ This Panel consists of representatives from GOHSEP, OCD, FEMA VAL, DCM, Lt. Governor's Office, UMCOR, and LHC.
- ▶ This Panel provides a platform for all agencies involved in the rehousing programs to resolve case issues on a collaborative level.
